Other stops along the way included places where Dr. King delivered speeches, quarters that housed slaves and an antebellum plantation in Columbus, GA. The group was also blessed to be able to attend President Jimmy Carter's Sunday School, at the Maranatha Baptist Church in Plains, GA. ACT Test Prep

ACT Practice Exams Wednesday's Jan. 31st and Feb. 7th 3-5PM Cost: \$25 Students will be administered two of the four ACT sections of the exam on each Wednesday. Results will be calculated and areas of deficiency will be highlighted and addressed.

ACT Mini Boot Camp Monday, Feb. 12 thru Friday Feb. 16th. Cost: \$10 per session per student, or \$50 per student for the whole camp. These sessions will review each of the five parts of the ACT, with a specific test on each section. Students will use their iPads for this camp.
